"Every human being has the inherent right to life."

ICCPR General Comment 36

I

The threat or use of nuclear weapons violates the right to life

States must take measures to stop the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction 3

States must provide reparations to victims of the testing or use of nuclear weapons




